### **Bidhan Chandra Krishi Viswavidyalaya (BCKV):**



BCKV was established in 1974. It aims to provide higher education in theoretical and technical fields of agriculture, horticulture and agricultural engineering. At present, the university has 25 major departments and an active directorate of research spread over the jurisdiction of the viswavidyalaya.

### **Kolkata:**

Kolkata, the capital city of West Bengal, is the second largest city in India after Mumbai, often referred to as the ‘Cultural Capital of India’. It flowered as the capital of British India during the nineteenth century, the heyday of the Raj. X’

### **Other tourist attractions:**

1. Dakshineswar Kali Temple is situated on the eastern bank of the Hooghly River is dedicated to Kali and was built in the middle of the 19<sup>th</sup> century by Rani Rashmoni.



2. Victoria Memorial Hall is a large marble building built between 1906 to 1921 in memory of Queen Victoria. It now acts as a museum and has 25 galleries.



3. Eden Gardens is a cricket ground in Kolkata established in 1864. It is the home venue of the Bengal cricket team and the IPL franchise cricket team Kolkata Knight Riders.



4. Howrah Bridge is a bridge commissioned in 1943 with a suspended span over the Hooghly River.



5. St. Paul’s Cathedral is said to be the first overseas cathedral built by the British. The church was completed in 1847 in an Indo-Gothic style.



6. Indian Museum, also known as Imperial Museum, is the largest and oldest museum in India. It has rare collections of antiques, armour, fossils, skeletons and Mughal paintings.
